Hope to see you all there!





Toby, beloved companion of Rene Kennicott, is an energetic young Bichon Frise born on March 17, 2024 (St. Patrick's Day—he looks great in



Top 10 ways to avoid heat stroke in dogs:

 Know the symptoms of early heat stroke: unanticipated restlessness, excessive heavy panting, drooling, weakness, and confusion.

- Never leave your dog in the car on a sunny, hot, or humid day.
- Buy an inexpensive kiddie pool and fill it with cool water.
- Avoid the beach and pavement when the sun is out—paw pads can burn.
- Always provide access to shade and fresh water.
- Wrap a freezer pack in a towel and let your dog lie next to it.
- Avoid being active with your dog during the peak heat of the day.
- Use fans. Dogs depend on evaporation for cooling off.
- Play it safe on hot, humid days—use air conditioning.
- Freeze an ice treat—beef or chicken broth make great frozen snacks.



Charlie found himself at Anchorage Animal Care and Control as an unclaimed stray. He

is an adorable and social "senior" who was diagnosed with cardiac health support needs. He has been adopted into a loving home where Friends of Pets assists with health care support.





Our sanctuary program

Our rescue program cares for two groups of animals who are with us long-term. Long-term fosters have no particular issues to prohibit adoption, but after one year still have not found a forever match. Sanctuary animals have poor adoption prospects due to old age, medical issues, or other problems, but their quality of life is good and euthanasia is not recommended. Still, the reality is that our commitment to their support diverts both space and finances from other animals who could be saved. We hold hope that each of these special souls may find a loving family of his or her very own. The sanctuary fund also helps support our adoptive families with some medical costs for special needs pets.

Spay/Neuter Community Assistance Program (Statewide)

If you are an Alaska resident and need financial help to spay or neuter your pet, we can help. We encourage you to apply for our spay/neuter community assistance program which operates year-round. FOP can provide a \$100 coupon to be applied toward the cost of spay/neuter surgery. Request forms and instructions are in the Help & Answers section at www.friendsofpets.org. Important! Be sure to read and follow the instructions, and apply before you schedule any procedures. You must have the coupon in hand prior to your pet's surgery. This program is funded through the annual Quilts & Creations Auction, and by our donors, to help stop pet overpopulation in Alaska.
